Subject: **Grant of exemption for Commercial and Airline Transport Pilot License to Defence Personnel.**

**1. Introduction**

- 1.1 Rule 41 of Aircraft Rules 1937 provides that any person who is a qualified pilot from the Indian Air Force, Indian Navy, Indian Army or Indian Coast Guard and who possesses the necessary flying experience, competency and standards of physical fitness as required under the rules may be exempted from all or any of the flying tests and from medical or other technical examinations by the Director General of Civil Aviation, in respect of the issue of licenses under the rules. In addition, defence personnel are also exempted from obtaining flying experience from DGCA approved / recognized training organization.
- 1.2 This CAR is issued under Rule 133A of the Aircraft Rules 1937, for providing exemptions to Defence personnel in accordance with Rule 41 of Aircraft Rules 1937 for issue of Commercial and Airline Transport Pilot License(s).

**2. Exemptions**

**2.1 Commercial Pilot's License (Aeroplane / Helicopter):**

Defence personnel while applying for issue of Commercial Pilot's Licence (Aeroplanes/Helicopter), along with the application form shall submit documentary evidences demonstrating compliance of the requirements as laid down in Section J and Section K (as applicable) of Schedule II of the Aircraft Rules 1937, except for the requirement mentioned in the following para;

- 2.1.1. **Knowledge:** Passing examination Aviation Meteorology and Aircraft Technical (General) conducted as per the provision in clause 1(d), section J and Section K.

2.1.2 **Skill:** Demonstrating competency in cross country flight requirement referred in clause 1 (h) (iii) & (iv), Section J.

**2.2. Airline Transport Pilot License (Aeroplane / Helicopter):**

Defence personnel while applying for issue of Airline Transport Pilot License (Aeroplane / Helicopter), along with the application form shall submit documentary evidences demonstrating compliance of all the requirements as laid down in Section M and N (as applicable) of Schedule II of Aircraft Rules 1937, except for the requirement mentioned in the following para;

2.2.1 **Knowledge** passing examination Aviation Meteorology and Aircraft Technical (General) conducted as per the provision in clause 1(d), Section M and Section N as applicable.

**3. Additional Requirements:** Defence pilot for issue of licence shall require to:

3.1 For the endorsement of any civil registered aircraft on license, the applicant shall complete the requirement as stipulated for the Extension of Aircraft Rating in the relevant section of Schedule II undergo the training as per the syllabus prescribed in relevant Civil Aviation Requirement (CAR) or syllabus approved by Flight Standard Directorate to meet the requirements of relevant Section of Schedule II, detail syllabus for this purpose provided in relevant Civil Aviation Requirement(CAR) in Section 7.

3.2 Flying Training, as required in clause 1(f), Section J and Section K of Schedule II of the Aircraft Rules 1937, for seeking endorsement on any civil registered aircraft shall be as per the syllabus approved in each individual case by Flight Standard Directorate. The flying training shall be completed to the satisfaction of the examiner before undergoing skill test on that type.
